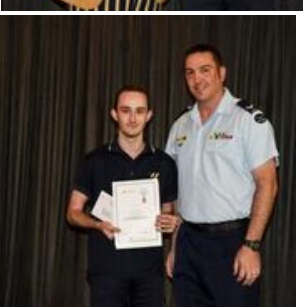

Artist Statement.

The names of the bugs are Swiping Earwig, Very Big Ant & Shining Moth. These prints titled as above, were created using dry point etching. I made these prints because I wanted to represent the link between insects and nature. The prints were created by researching scientific drawings of insects and sketching life

drawings of plants discovered in the school garden. A combination of insects and plants was then designed. I chose the insects because the scientific illustrations had strong lines which I thought would transfer well into print. I chose these scientific drawings because I thought they would combine well with plants. I collected Botanic plants from the school garden and created life drawings from these. The process of dry point etching was interesting. The etching was a little trickier than I thought it would be. You need to make sure the grooves are the same depth, all over. Or if you press lightly it will create texture. I chose the colors and with some help we rubbed the ink into the etching. We then wet the paper and squeezed the excess water out. We then put the paper and etching in the press, and then turned the wheel to print. I was happy with the end designs. If I did this again I would choose a more detailed design.



The school garden is a very magnificent place and it sure has a lot of things to do and it gives me bountiful amount of ideas for the future, my favorite part about the garden is trying out new fruit and vegetables. However, everything requires to be watered and some parts require to be watered very often such as my garden bed. The best thing about showing scientific illustrations of insects mixed with sketches of plants that grew out of the school garden is that we can show them the beauty of the garden while also showing artistic skills to my art class.
