The Valley View Secondary School team was excited to compete especially after the event was cancelled last year as a result of COVID-19 restrictions.

VVSS is in the "B" grade, and even though we are one of the smallest teams we have a great impact in getting results. With a team of about thirty five athletes we managed to cover most events and the students were prepared for a tough day. We had some early successes in the day with Denisia Pezos Year 8 girls coming 3rd in the 200m sprint and then going on and getting 2nd in Long Jump and 3rd in High Jump. Best in our year 8 boys was Andrej Jovanovic taking 2nd place in the 100m sprint then going up a grade into the year 9 boys and placing 3rd in the 100m sprint and a 2nd in the 200m sprint.

The year 9 girls had the best results for the day with Erin Taylor, Keysha Sullivan & Talia Reed achieving 3rd's in the 100m, 200m sprint & Long Jump with Zarah Zawitkowski coming 2nd in Shot Put, Discus and a 3rd in Javelin. Other mentions for the day was Kendal Kalaba with a 2nd in 100M and Shayla Kalaba with a 2nd in the Shot Put. In Senior Boys we had Harry Doelu with a 1st in the 100m sprint.










Visual Arts


